15th	Heigham Park Centenary Celebration (11am to 4pm)	"Food stalls, tea and cake, picnic area, fun dog show, children's activities and games, football, tennis and bowls, local live music and dance, art and craft, plant and book stalls, blow-up Dalek."
17th	Eid al-Adha (Islam)	Eid ul-Adha is the Islamic celebration of sacrifice. It is celebrated for three to four days. It is a special time for prayer, spending time with family and giving presents. Eid greeting: "Eid Mubarak!"
17-23rd	Refugee Week	Refugee Week is the world's largest arts & culture festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary. https://refugeeweek.org.uk/
15-19 June	Hajj (Islam)	Hajj is a holy pilgrimage to Mecca in Saudi Arabia that Muslims must try to complete at least once in their lifetime.
22nd	Windrush Day	Windrush Day remembers the day when around 500 migrants from the Caribbean arrived at Tilbury Docks in Essex in 1948.

Litha/Midsummer: June 19-23

"In Finland (and other Nordic countries), midsummer is a big celebration. It is a celebration of nightless night and the longest day of the year. It is celebrated on the Saturday between 20th and 26th of June. People get together, usually at someone's country house (mökki), have midsummer sauna with a "vihta" (a bunch of young birch branches tied together), you whip yourself and others with it in the sauna. It's very nice and smells lovely!"
